



Plant Management Safety Training Scheme (PMSTS)



Course Objectives:

This course covers all the relevant legislation and other aspects which affect safe working in the construction plant, civil engineering and building industries. It highlights the need for risk assessment in the workplace, the implementation of necessary control measures and adequate communication to sustain a health and safety culture among the workforce.

Who Should Attend?

Plant managers, plant instructions, workshop managers, project managers, agents and persons who are, or are about to be, responsible for planning organising, monitoring, controlling and administering staff, groups of staff and workforce.

Course Content:

The aims of this course are to help plant managers, instructors, agents and supervisors to:

- Manage health and safety on site, training areas and workshop areas in accordance with legal provisions, and within the context of their management or supervisory roles
- Develop an understanding of responsibilities and accountability for site health, safety and welfare
- Recognise that safe sites, training areas and workshops are efficient, economical and productive.

At the end of the course delegates will be aware of and be able to:

- Implement all health, safety, welfare and environmental legislation that will effect them during their daily work
- Implement new guidance and industry best practice
- State their duties and responsibilities with regards to health, safety, welfare and the environment.

Delegates will be required to complete 3 core exercises, a case study and a multiple-choice assessment. On passing these they will receive a Construction Skills Certificate that is valid for 5 years.
