



NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Safety & Health



Course Objectives:

As stated within the Health & Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 and the Management of Health & Safety at Work Regulations 1999, any manager who is appointed to control health and safety issues must be 'suitably and sufficiently trained'. The NEBOSH National General Certificate is an examined basic level qualification designed to provide this necessary knowledge and understanding of health & safety.

Who Should Attend?

Directors, Managers, Supervisors, Team Leaders or Safety Representatives who play a significant role within the management of organisational health & safety.

Duration: 13 days (including exams)

Course Content:

The syllabus is divided into 3 units:

NGC1 – Management of Health & Safety

- Foundations in health and safety
- Health & safety management systems (Policy)
- Health & safety management systems (Organising)
- Health & safety management systems (Planning)
- Health & safety management systems (Measuring, Audit & Review)

NGC 2 – Controlling Workplace Hazards

- Workplace hazards and risk control
- Transport hazards and risk control
- Musculoskeletal hazards and risk control
- Work equipment hazards and risk control
- Electrical safety
- Fire safety
- Chemical and biological health hazards and risk control
- Physical and psychological health hazards and control

NGC 3 – Health & Safety Practical Application

- Carry out unaided a workplace safety inspection
- Prepare a report that persuasively urges management to take appropriate action, explaining why and identifying remedial measures.

Tuition time of 80 hours will be delivered and NEBOSH advises a further 49 hours of private study to ensure a successful result.

2 hour written exams for both units NGC1 and NGC2 must be passed to gain the qualification.
